Bracken Hall is open every weekend to the public to enable them to visit the wildlife garden and exhibition room and take part in family drop-in activities.

Purpose of role	Our volunteers help to keep Bracken Hall Countryside Centre open to the public on Saturdays and Sundays between 12pm and 4pm.
Description of duties	 Welcoming visitors and giving them information about the activities at Bracken Hall; Directing visitors to the trail in the garden and the exhibitions in the Centre; Setting up family drop-in activities in the classroom; General duties including opening and closing the Centre, handling cash, and keeping the Centre tidy.
Time commitment	Each shift is a maximum of 4½ hours (including opening and closing the Centre). A typical volunteer commits to one shift per month, although there is no limit to the number of shifts you can volunteer for. We know that people have lots of other things going on in their lives and we try and be as flexible as possible. A rota is to be coordinated on a month-to-month basis.
Skills and qualifications	 We are looking for people who are: Interested in nature and the local countryside; Friendly and enjoy working with people; Enthusiastic; Reliable; Willing to get involved.
