



# BAILDON YOUTH COUNCIL BACKGROUND INFO

Local youth councils are forums that represent the views of young people at a local level. Run by young people for young people, they give young people a voice and enable them to make their views heard in the decision-making process. They give young people the chance to discuss relevant issues, engage with decision makers and contribute to improving the lives of young people within their communities. There are currently over 620 youth councils active across the UK. They work with all levels of local government including Parish and Community Councils as well as Unitary Authorities, Borough and County Councils. *British Youth Council 2016*

Youth councils identified their role within the local community as follows:

- representing the views of local young people to decision-makers
- campaigning on issues that are important to young people
- sitting on Youth Opportunity Fund panels
- reviewing the Children's Plan
- sitting on scrutiny panels within their local council
- running the Youth Opportunity Fund
- inspecting local services

## *Youth Led Consultation, Surveys, Campaigns, Fundraising and Partnership Work*

### *Why?*

- Working with community organisation across Baildon to make positive changes in Baildon Community around **4 issues** that are most important to the Young People and the Community in Baildon.
- Supporting British Youth Council and UK Youth Parliament on their most important national and local campaigns
- Attend **one** campaign event on youth issues
- Do **two** fundraising events
- Work with Titus Salts Secondary School and local primary schools in Baildon to deliver youth sessions in school, youth led consultation and promotion of Baildon Youth Council.

## *Detached Outreach Work and Projects*

In partnership with Bradford Youth Service, run a weekly open access youth club and deliver a 2 hour detached session per week, responding the concerns of local community members and the **issues** identified by young people

# YOUTH COUNCIL

## ***What young people get out of engaging in a Youth Council***

- Improved knowledge and awareness of national and community issues through games, activities and discussion.
- Increased motivation through ideas into action, gaining positive reward from seeing change and possessing the awareness for the need for change.
- Opportunities to be engaged in purposeful collective action that can lead to constructive social change or improvements in conditions for themselves and others.
- Have the ability, opinions and desires to make a difference.
- Receive training to empower, improve skills and enable the young people to have the capacity to contribute effectively and gain accredited qualifications.
- Provides a forum and consultation mechanism through which the 'voice' and views of young people can be presented to Town Council and any other bodies with responsibility in Baildon, to offer valuable input in shaping the community.
- Provide an organisation through which young people who have a vested interest in politics, can become active citizens of Baildon and take responsibility for community improvement through various activities.
- Become resourceful, connected, experienced and independent; young people know how to access and navigate their ways through different settings and institutions which will enforce their skills and contribute to a successful social and employable future.
- Increased confidence and self-esteem, in own ability to voice opinions, demonstrate skills and make decisions that will have a positive impact on all areas of their life.

# YOUTH COUNCIL

## ***Mechanisms of a successful Youth Council***

- 1.) ***Strong Foundation-*** Regular, accessible, inclusive and appropriate meeting place. Focusing on the commitment and personal development of existing members, who set the mission statement and goals of the youth council, whilst persistently recruiting new members to create a manageable sized group.
- 2.) ***Infrastructure-*** Appropriate assessment and management of funding.
- 3.) ***Work Environment-*** Staff are committed to working in partnership with the young people to design the content of the programme of the Youth Council, to provide a fun, safe and engaging environment for all young people to improve knowledge and awareness of national and community issues.
- 4.) ***Building Youth Capacity-*** Utilise roles and teams within the Youth Council and provide skill building for youth.
- 5.) ***Deepening Motivation-*** Connect young people's immediate issues to broader systemic challenges, so they feel they are part of something bigger that has a lot of meaning to them. Encourage young people to do their own research and plan discussions to be fed back into Youth Council meetings. Working with young people in a creative way, encouraging feedback on activities delivered, to ensure they want to come back.
- 6.) ***Creating Opportunities-*** Communicate, liaise and develop positive working relationships with a variety of organisations outside the youth council to facilitate and integrate members into local authority so they can advise and testify at decision-making processes or public hearings. Baildon Council have co-opted a Youth Council Member as a non-voting member of the Community Committee to represent the voice of youth in Baildon. Shared belief that youth engagement is good for community and both local and national government, whilst remembering they are still young people.

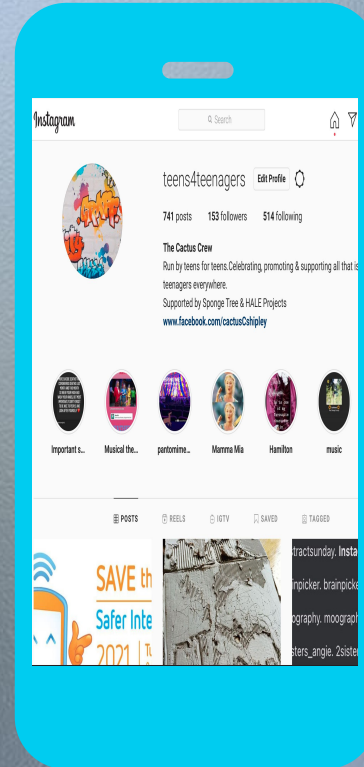

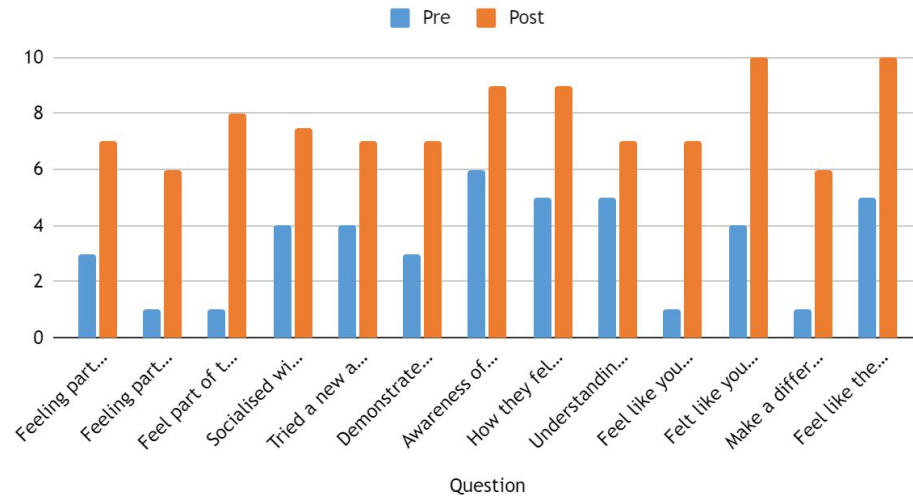

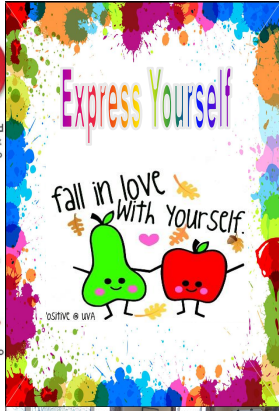

**Youth Council Members approach Titus Salts School staff to support Anti-Bullying week and promote continued awareness through Anti-Bullying activities and badges.**



School students fed back that they felt more confident to talk to teachers when they were actively promoting awareness around bullying, for example when the staff were wearing the t-shirts for anti-bullying week. Expanding on this idea, the youth council came up with the proposal that the teachers would wear "No BULLIES Here" Badges all year round which would continue to highlight the issue and show supporting approach.

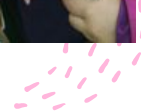

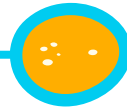

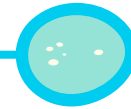
